

#### **Research on Cursive Handwriting**

In Waldorf schools, children learn cursive handwriting. Another scientific study on the benefits of handwriting was published this summer in *Frontiers in Psychology* Magazine. The study by Norwegian University of Science and Technology "The Importance of Cursive Handwriting Over Typewriting for Learning in the Classroom: A High Density EEG Study of 12-Year-Old Children and Young Adults" found that cursive writing and drawing activated brain areas important for memory and the encoding of new information and therefore helped "provide the brain with optimal conditions for learning."
